

Quilting Goodland - New Exhibit



Quilts have been used for thousands of years. In the early days of America, quilts were used mainly for utilitarian purposes; keeping warm and covering doors and windows to keep the cold out. Fabric was often expensive and not wanting to waste material blankets were often patched or combined with other blankets. Once fabric was manufactured in America and became cheaper, did quilting become what we know today. Many of the designs became elaborate and before the Civil War were used to make political statements, named in honor of a famous person, and became a symbol of friendship. Quilts were seen as a symbol of affluence and during the 1920's and 1930's sewing machines made it easier to quilt. However, during the Depression these conveniences were no longer around and this meant a resurgence in hand quilting. During WWII, quilting took a back seat as women went to work and did not make a big comeback until the Centennial. In the 1990's quilts were displayed as pieces of artwork and can be seen at the High Plains Museum and Carnegie Arts Center during the month of April.

The quilts on display are from the community and are truly a representation of Goodland. This exhibit is in conjunction with the *130th Birthday Celebration*. We will have a variety of quilts on display; from historical to contemporary you will see them all! While at the High Plains Museum visitors can vote for their favorite quilt in a weekly vote and design their own arts and craft quilt block to create a community quilt on our wall. Keep your ears open for a special guest speaker to teach about quilts.


