Presentations and Proclamations:

A. Topside Manor Presentation

The Sherman County Public Building Commission, which was established by the County Commission after citizens voiced their concerns over the state of the County's nursing home, will present the "Topside Manor" project, which is a proposal to build a new nursing home facility in Goodland. A vote has been scheduled for April 28 which would authorize the County Commission to exceed their tax lid so that they can pay the debt service on a bond issue which would fund this project.

Consent Agenda:

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move that we approve Consent Agenda items A and B.

Formal Actions:

A. Property and Liability Insurance Renewal; Jeanette Ruddel, Eklund Insurance

The City's property and liability insurance is up for renewal, as our term is from April 1 to April 1 annually. Jeanette Ruddell and Jacque Livengood of Eklund Insurance, who the City uses to quote various insurance companies, will be at the meeting to present the City's options. Included in your Agenda Packet is a letter from Eklunds with some insurance history on the City of Goodland, followed by a spreadsheet breaking down quotes from EMC Insurance and State National. Eklunds and staff recommend awarding EMC's policy, which has a cost of \$279,261, which is slightly higher than State National's \$252,917 but State National's deductible for wind/hail is \$100,000, which is huge.

The City can decrease its EMC premium cost from \$279,261 to \$264,538 by increasing its property deductible from \$5,000 to \$10,000 and its wind/hail from \$10,000 to \$25,000, and we are recommending this modification be made. Lastly, Eklund's and staff recommend that the City retain its Cyber Liability policy, which through Saville Insurance/BCS Insurance Company and provides \$3 million of coverage for \$6,009.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: I move that we approve the property and liability insurance policy as presented in the amount of \$264,538 and the cyber liability policy in the amount of \$6,008 to Eklunds Insurance.

Discussion:

A. Contract with EBH for Engineering Services: Taxiway B Reconstruction Project

Included in your Agenda Packet is a contract for engineering services with EBH Engineering for the Taxiway B Reconstruction Project. This contract includes design engineering of both "phases" of the Taxiway B reconstruction, even though we are only set to construct Phase 1 at this time. The cost for design engineering both is \$20,000, with construction engineering services at-cost plus \$3,000. Andrew Brunner with EBH will be at the meeting to answer any questions from Commissioners about the contract or the project, and we would plan for Commissioners to take action on this item at the next meeting on April 6.

B. Review of Board Applicants

An application from Terry Leonhart, who is seeking appointment to the Cemetery Board, is included in your Agenda Packet. Terry attended the Cemetery Board meeting on March 12, and the Board recommended his appointment.

C. <u>Home Rehabilitation Program</u>

This program was introduced to the Commission at their March 2 meeting. Commissioners at the meeting recommended that a requirement be added to the program that grant recipients have the live in their home for a set number of years after receiving funds, but an exact number of years has not yet been set. In addition, Commissioners recommended that the language about funds being used for driveway, walkway and fencing repairs be removed. The proposal is again included in your Agenda Packet with changes shown in red. Additional feedback on the proposal is requested from the City Commission at this time.

March 2, 2020 5:00 P.M.

Mayor John Garcia called the meeting to order with Vice-Mayor Aaron Thompson and Commissioner J. J. Howard responding to roll call. Commissioner Jay Dee Brumbaugh and Commissioner Gary Farris were reported absent.

Also present were Rich Simon – Director of Public Works, Dustin Bedore – Director of Electric Utilities, Joni Showalter-Police Chief, Joshua Jordan – IT Director, Sami Windle – Museum Director, Mary Volk - City Clerk and Andrew Finzen - City Manager.

Mayor Garcia led Pledge of Allegiance

 ON A MOTION by Vice-Mayor Thompson to approve Consent Agenda seconded by Commissioner Howard. MOTION carried on a VOTE of 3-0.

Commissioner Farris reported to the meeting.

FORMAL ACTIONS

- A. CMB License Application: Dollar General Store Andrew stated, application is to approve a CMB license for Dollar General in original and unopened containers. City Code requires first time applicant to have individual present at meeting. Michael Lehman is present for Dollar General. All inspections are complete and recommend approval. ON A MOTION by Commissioner Farris to approve CMB License for Dollar General seconded by Commissioner Howard. MOTION carried on a VOTE of 4-0.
- **B. Revised Web Hosting Agreement with Sherman County -** Andrew stated, the Commission previously approved the agreement but the County Attorney recommended minor language amendments to the contract. Jake has no problem with the changes. The County Commission approved the contract with amendments. **ON A MOTION by** Vice-Mayor Thompson to approve the revised Web Hosting Agreement with Sherman County **seconded by** Commissioner Howard. **MOTION carried on a VOTE of 4-0.**

DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Housing Rehabilitation Program – Andrew stated, a priority item from our goal setting workshop was to provide citizens incentives to rehabilitate properties within City limits. I have provided a draft proposal for the program. I recommend starting the project with initial funding of \$10,000 from Professional Services in Building Inspection. The purpose is to assist homeowners bring property into compliance with health and safety issues. I have set a minimum of \$1,000 in repairs, with 50% match from homeowner. Maximum City share per property is \$3,000. I have modeled eligibility requirements for the program after similar programs in other communities. Mayor Garcia asked, what is classified as low income? Andrew stated, there are different standards with every program. If it is our program, we can establish the limits. I would be in favor of having a box they can check for low income to have that be a qualifier down the road if necessary. If the program is only low income, I do not think some will apply. Mayor Garcia stated, I agree with the minimum requirement and the fact that the homeowner has to have an investment in program. Commissioner Howard

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stated, I was involved in a similar program in another community where the homeowner had to provide tax returns and live in home for ten years. Their program was scaled for the amount property owner paid based on income level. I feel we do not need to include fencing or driveways in program, only the structure. That program concentrated on heating and air conditioner, then the bath for mold issues, then windows. Mayor Garcia stated, those items cost more than \$1,000. Mary stated, the previous CDBG grant required property owner to live in house after rehabilitation for period of time or they reimburse money used. Vice-Mayor Thompson stated, I like the idea of the owner residing in house after improvement and a benefit based on scaled income level. This is a good start to move forward on. Commissioner Farris stated, I feel if they have to put money into the project, they will cut down on purchasing their medicine because they cannot afford both. Andrew stated, we can continue to discuss in future meetings.

REPORTS

- A. City Manager 1. County Commission approved waiver of landfill fees for spring cleanup April 20th through 24th.
 2. The attorneys have met to discuss fire merger. It was a good meeting to get framework for paperwork.
 3. Topside Trail project is moving forward; they are working on strip behind tennis courts to tie into Cherry Street. We have paid about one-third of the contract to date.
 4. Dakota Roubideaux is at residential inspection certification this week and Brian James is at fire inspection school.
 5. Airport Board met and there is not much savings to delay KDOT Taxiway B project so we will complete project this fall to align with agriculture sprayers. Mayor Garcia asked, have you found dates to meet with County Commission for joint meeting? Commissioner Howard stated, it needs to be a night meeting. Andrew stated, I have not at this point but will do if Commission would like a meeting.
 6. I distributed information where City ended in FY19 on utility and general funds.
- **B.** City Clerk Mary stated, we worked with PIC to hold employee meetings for all benefits and ensure compliance with Affordable Care Act. Agents for American Fidelity and AFLAC have met with employees and necessary changes are being made. We are in process of bidding property insurance, assisting Parks and Street and Alley departments with interviews, updating meter reading system, working with Tantalus and normal daily operations. Trying to begin budget information.
- C. Museum Director Sami stated, in 2019 visitors were up to 4,244, donations totaled \$5,115.07 and gift shop sales were \$463.52. We currently have Imagination Playground exhibit and are working on a WW II exhibit and the cemetery tour. Our fundraiser is scheduled for March 28th at the Elks Club. On February 25th the Museum Alliance met in Washington DC to share facts on Museums.
- D. IT Director Joshua stated, normal day to day operations to keep system running. I have been working on backup and recovery processes to insure they keep working. I am reviewing security logs and preparing bids for phone and internet services. Recently I merged the Go Goodland, Goodland Chamber and See Goodland websites into Go Goodland and traffic has increased. Vice-Mayor Thompson asked, are we working on process to move ahead with a video of meetings? Joshua stated, the problem with live video is someone is required to be present each meeting to video. We have done preliminary checks on equipment but it will be a delay video. If we do live stream, your audience will disappear because people will watch it online. We also have to consider budget and see where money will come from. Mayor Garcia asked, have you estimated the cost? Joshua stated, for equipment used about fifty hours a year for delay video, about \$1,500 to \$2,000 for startup. That does not consider services to host videos. We can host on website but will run into speed issues. Mayor Garcia asked, if livestream what are costs? Joshua stated, probably an additional \$1,500 but numbers are estimated. Mayor Garcia stated, so \$6,000 to \$7,000 would cover costs? Joshua stated, most likely, yes. Vice-Mayor Thompson stated, I would like to see live feed as it is better to have

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more people watching to be informed. Andrew stated, Joshua and I have been discussing this for a while and our intention is to bring proposal to you, but we have nothing concrete at this time. Joshua stated, we also have to have policies in place for open records and retention.

E. Commissioners

Vice-Mayor Thompson -1. We talked about a purchasing policy and getting bids, I want this to remain a priority. 2. After going over the contracts, I feel we need to have a special meeting to go over contracts to discuss what we would like to continue or change in future.

Commissioner Brumbaugh – 1. Absent, No Report.

Commissioner Howard - 1. I had a few residents ask why we used a back hoe to put in water line in at Gun Club instead of trenching. Rich stated, because project was low priority and completed as we had time and help. I did not want to leave ditch open for long period of time. Commissioner Howard asked, it would have taken four hours to trench. Rich stated, probably but if we did not have help to work on project, the trench would remain open. Commissioner Howard asked, do we have a trencher to do work? Dustin stated, Rich asked me to trench it, but our trencher is not wide or deep enough plus there are a lot of underground utilities that would have required backhoe work. 2. All departments. seem to be doing good which I like to see.

Commissioner Farris -1. What are wages for the van drivers? Mary stated, low, around \$8.25. I have a note to discuss with Andrew during budget.

F. Mayor – 1. What openings are there on our Boards? Andrew stated, three on Construction Board of Trades, one each on Museum and Cemetery and all positions on Planning Commission. 2. Thank you to employees for good job.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

A. Executive Session - Under the authority of KSA 75-4319(b)(1) for personnel matters for nonelected personnel - Mayor Garcia made a motion at 5:45 p.m. to recess into executive session under authority of K.S.A.75-4319 (b)(1) for personnel matters for nonelected personnel not to exceed forty-five minutes. I request only the Commission be present. Commissioner Howard seconded the motion. MOTION carried by a VOTE of 4-0. Meeting resumed at 6:30 p.m. Mayor Garcia made a second motion at 6:31 p.m. to recess into executive session under authority of K.S.A.75-4319 (b)(1) for personnel matters for nonelected personnel not to exceed twenty minutes. I request only the Commission be present. Commissioner Howard seconded the motion. MOTION carried by a VOTE of 4-0. Meeting resumed at 6:51 p.m.

ADJOURNMENT WAS HAD ON A MOTION Commissioner Farris seconded by Vice-Mayor Thompson. Motion carried by unanimous VOTE, meeting adjourned at 6:52 p.m. Next meeting is scheduled for March 16, 2020.

I would like to begin by giving you a little insurance history on The City of Goodland and their insurance over the past several years. EMC was the carrier on the Commercial Package for 20+plus years. In 2016, due to the driving history of two city employees, EMC wanted to exclude those employees as drivers. It was determined by the City officials that these drivers could not be excluded, so we looked for insurance with other carriers. We contacted Saville Insurance out of Georgia and were able to write the city's insurance through Saville as a broker.

When an agency writes insurance directly with a standard company, like EMC Insurance, we have a contract and directly work with an underwriter. When an agency writes through a broker, it limits our control since we have to work through the broker and not directly with the insurance company. Saville Insurance has been good to work with however, if you can write directly with a company it is better for the customer.

We have been trying to find the best coverage for the City of Goodland's Commercial Insurance. This year, we have received two different quotes with comparable coverages. One quote was from EMC Insurance and another quote through Saville Insurance, as a broker, with the company State National. We also received a quote denial from Traveler's Insurance. Attached you will find a spreadsheet showing the coverage's and premiums that EMC and State National are offering.

When meeting with Andrew & Mary on Thursday to discuss our quotes, we presented the EMC quote for the following reasons: EMC Insurance is A+ rated standard company with an office in Wichita, Kansas. State National is an A rated company that is operated through Saville Insurance as their broker out of Georgia.

With EMC Insurance, we are familiar with their claim service. Travis Brown, with Kansas Claims of Goodland, is often assigned by EMC to adjust their claims. State National will not offer a local adjuster and we would, again, have to work through the broker to get the claim settled. Having a local adjuster can speed up the claims process.

EMC offers a Safety Dividend Program for city's that participate in the Kansas Municipal Utilities Safety Group Insurance Program. The City of Goodland has potential to receive a check for this program in 2021. In 2016, when the City was previously with EMC, they received a safety dividend check for \$39,044.29. Please remember that this amount may fluctuate and is not guaranteed every year.

EMC offers online safety programs and a program where you can call an attorney directly for legal questions. State National offers online training modules for their clients as well.

The property deductible was another important factor in our decision to pursue the EMC quote. EMC is offering the property deductibles of \$5,000 All-Peril and \$10,000 for Wind/Hail. State National's deductibles for the property is \$5,000 All-Peril and \$100,000 for Wind/Hail. Due to our area, State National will not allow us to change the Wind/Hail deducible. When we compare the property deductibles, we do not feel that the premium difference is significant enough to justify State National's extremely high Wind/Hail deductible if the City of Goodland was to experience a wind/hail loss. Both companies have given us other optional quotes with different deductibles, if you are interested in reviewing those with us, please contact our office.

CONTRACT FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES

for GOODLAND MUNICIPAL AIRPORT RECONSTRUCT TAXIWAY B

This Contract, made and executed in duplicate this _____ day of _____, 2020, by and between the CITY OF GOODLAND, KANSAS, hereinafter called OWNER, party of the first part, and EVANS, BIERLY, HUTCHISON & ASSOCIATES, P. A., Consulting Engineers, Goodland, Kansas, hereinafter called ENGINEER, party of the second part.

The Project includes the Design and Construction Engineering services to complete the Reconstruction of Taxiway B at the Goodland Municipal Airport, Goodland, Kansas.

WITNESSETH; THAT in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, the OWNER hereby agrees to employ the ENGINEER to perform Engineering Services herein outlined and to make payment for these services as set forth below.

SECTION 1 - ENGINEERING SERVICES:

1.1 DESIGN ENGINEERING SERVICES

- 1.1.1 Consult with Utility Companies and local FAA field office and provide information to them regarding the proposed construction.
- 1.1.2 Conduct Field Design surveys for the Project. Surveys shall locate existing utilities, facilities, and structures on the airport property within 200' of the Project.
- 1.1.3 Design and prepare working drawings and specifications for the project in accordance with the **OWNER's** guidelines and those required by the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) Division of Aviation grant.
- 1.1.4 Review Preliminary plans with the **OWNER**. Make changes as necessary. Include Safety Plan/Requirements for Contractor Safety Plan, and Detailed Cost Opinion.
- 1.1.5 Review final plans and specifications with **OWNER**. Include Safety Plan/Requirements for Contractor Safety Plan, Updated Cost Opinion (if changes occur) and Construction Observation Program (COP).
- 1.1.6 Submit all necessary paperwork and correspondence to KDOT Division of Aviation for compliance with the project associated Grant.
- 1.1.7 Assist in advertising the project to contractors. Provide bid documents to those Contractors interested at cost. Attend the bid letting, prepare Engineer's Estimate, assist and advise the **OWNER** in opening bids, awarding construction contract and contract preparation. Furnish Tabulation of Bids to **OWNER** and KDOT.

1.2 CONSTRUCTION ENGINEERING SERVICES

- 1.2.1 Conduct a preconstruction conference with the **OWNER** and contractor. Assist the **OWNER** in obtaining DBE participation information from Contractor, if required.
- 1.2.2 Review submittals by the construction contractors.
- 1.2.3 Define all Project areas in the field.
- 1.2.4 Prepare change orders for approval by the **OWNER**.
- 1.2.5 Create, review and validate the contractor's monthly and final payment requests and forward payment requests to the **OWNER**.
- 1.2.6 Design Engineer will make periodic and final site inspections and will provide contract document interpretations.

- 1.2.7 The **ENGINEER** will provide a full-time competent Resident Project Representative (RPR) and such assistant RPR's as may be required on the work. The RPR and assistants will observe the work while construction is in progress. Construction services are based on 40 working days for Phase 1 and 40 working days for phase 2. The RPR shall not have responsibility for the superintendence of construction site conditions, operation, equipment, or personnel other than employees of the **ENGINEER**. The RPR will maintain a daily log of construction activities. Written construction progress reports will be furnished to the **OWNER**. Such construction observation does not guarantee the work of the contractor nor provide any control over the contractor's work method. The presence or absence of a construction observer does not relieve the contractor of his responsibility to properly prosecute the work nor does it relieve the contractor of his responsibility for safety at the work site.
- 1.2.8 Perform post construction activities to fully document work performed on the Airfield, and compliance with FAA Design guidelines.
- 1.2.9 Provide as-constructed drawings (paper and electronic) of the completed project to the **OWNER**.
- 1.3 PROJECT CLOSEOUT
 - 1.3.1 The **ENGINEER** will complete the closeout documentation for the **OWNER** within the required timeframe. This timeframe will commence on the date the project is accepted from the contractor.
- 1.4 CHANGES IN SERVICES
 - 1.4.1 The **OWNER** may request changes in the scope of the services of the **ENGINEER**. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of the **ENGINEER'S** compensation, which are mutually agreed upon by and between the **OWNER** and the **ENGINEER**, shall be incorporated in written amendments to this contract.

SECTION 2 - OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- 2.1 **OWNER** shall provide full information to **ENGINEER** concerning the PROJECT including all available plans, maps, plats, documents, grant conditions, other reports and correspondence, and the **OWNER**'s recommendations.
- 2.2 **OWNER** shall examine and review the plans and inform **ENGINEER** regarding any decision thereto.
- 2.3 **OWNER** shall pay **ENGINEER** at monthly intervals for Engineering Services under this contract based on the percentage of work completed according to the following schedule:
 - 2.3.1 For services under paragraphs 1.1 (Design Engineering Services)

Reconstruct Taxiway B

The **OWNER** agrees to pay the **ENGINEER** a Fixed Lump Sum Payment of <u>\$ 20,000.00</u>.. This will be the total compensation for the scope of work outlined in this contract except by supplementary contract by the parties hereto with prior approval by the **OWNER**.

2.3.2 For services under paragraphs 1.2 (Construction Services)

Reconstruct Taxiway B - Phase 1

The **OWNER** agrees to pay the **ENGINEER** actual cost, plus a net fee for profit of \$\sum_\$ 3,000.00 The maximum total compensation for Section 1.2, Construction Services, shall not exceed \$\sum_\$ 30,000.00 except by supplementary contract by the parties hereto with prior approval by the **OWNER**.

Reconstruct Taxiway B - Phase 2

The **OWNER** agrees to pay the **ENGINEER** actual cost, plus a net fee for profit of \$\frac{\\$}{20,000.00}\$ The maximum total compensation for Section 1.2, Construction Services, shall not exceed \$\frac{\\$}{20,000.00}\$ except by supplementary contract by the parties hereto with prior approval by the **OWNER**.

2.3.3 For services under paragraph 1.3. As set forth in the Contract for additional services.

SECTION 3 - THE PARTIES HERETO MUTUALLY AGREE:

- 3.1 The **ENGINEER** agrees to commence work in accordance with the terms of this contract within seven (7) calendar days from the date of notice to proceed.
- 3.2 The **ENGINEER** agrees to complete the preparation of construction drawings and specifications for the Project improvements and assist with the Bid Opening and award documentation to match the timelines for the corresponding FAA project at the airport in an effort to have both projects do not conflict during construction
- 3.3 The **ENGINEER** agrees to only claim compensation for Phase 1 for Construction Services unless KDOT Aviation funds the Phase 2 grant. At any point in the future when KDOT Aviation funds the Phase 2 grant scope, claims for compensation for Phase 2 Construction Services will begin. If Phase 2 is never awarded by KDOT Aviation, no compensation claims for Phase 2 Construction Services.

STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS EVANS, BIERLY, HUTCHISON & ASSOCIATES, P.A.

SECTION 1: Scope of Work

Evans, Bierly, Hutchison & Associates, P.A. (hereinafter referred to as **EBH**) shall perform the services defined in the contract for the stated fee arrangement. **Client** may request incidental or additional services not specified in the contract which change the Scope of Work and **EBH** will provide these additional services at the contract fee schedule rate; provided, that if such additional services are beyond the scope of the contract, the fee arrangement will be negotiated at the time such services are requested.

SECTION 2: Access to Site

Unless otherwise stated, **EBH** will have access to the site for activities necessary for the performance of the services. **EBH** will take reasonable precautions to minimize damages due to these activities, but has not included in the fee the cost of restoration of any resulting damage.

SECTION 3: Dispute Resolution

Claims or disputes between **Client** and **EBH** arising during design, construction, or post-construction shall be submitted to non-binding mediation. **Client** and **EBH** agree to include a similar mediation agreement with all contractors, subconsultants, suppliers, and fabricators, thereby providing for mediation as the primary method for dispute resolution between all parties.

SECTION 4: Billings and Payments

Invoices for **EBH**'s services shall be submitted, at **EBH**'s option, either upon completion of such services or on a monthly basis. Invoices shall be payable within 30 days after the invoice date. Payment shall not be contingent upon actions or participation of any party other than **Client**. In the event of a disputed or contested invoice, only the portion so contested shall be withheld from payment.

Interest at a rate of 1.5% per month, or the maximum allowed by law, will be charged on past due amounts starting 60 days after the date of the invoice. Payments will first be credited to interest and then to principal. No interest will accrue on any reasonably contested portion of an invoice until mutually resolved. If **Client** fails to make payment in full within 60 days after the date of an undisputed invoice, **EBH** may, without waiving any claim or right against **Client** and without liability whatsoever to **Client**, terminate the performance of services. In the event any portion of an account remains unpaid 90 days after billing, **Client** shall pay all costs of collection, including reasonable attorney's fees.

SECTION 5: Ownership of Documents

All reports, plans, specifications, calculations, estimates, documents, and other work products, including all work products on electronic media, prepared by **EBH** as instruments of service shall remain the property of **EBH**. Client agrees to hold harmless, indemnify, and defend **EBH** against all damages, claims, and losses arising out of the reuse of or changes made to plans and specifications without the written authorization of **EBH**.

SECTION 6: Standard of Care

Services provided by **EBH** under the contract will be performed in a manner consistent with that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the same profession currently practicing under similar circumstances. No other warranty, express or implied, is made or intended by the contract for services.

SECTION 7: Construction Methods and Job Site Safety

EBH will not have control over or charge of, and will not be responsible for, construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, or procedures, nor for safety precautions and programs in connection with the work.

SECTION 8: Certifications, Guarantees, and Warranties

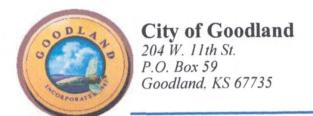
EBH shall not be required to execute any document that would result in **EBH**'s having to certify, guarantee, or warrant the existence of conditions whose existence **EBH** cannot ascertain.

SECTION 9: Termination of Services

Either **Client** or **EBH** may terminate the contract at any time with or without cause upon giving the other party 7 days prior written notice. In the event of termination, **Client** shall pay **EBH** for all services rendered and all reimbursable expenses up to the date of termination, plus reasonable termination expenses.

SECTION 10: Limitation of Liability

In recognition of the relative risks, rewards, and benefits of the project to both Client and EBH, the risks have been allocated such that Client agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to limit EBH's liability to Client and to all construction contractors and subcontractors on the project for any and all claims, losses, expenses, or damages arising out of the contract from any cause or causes, so that the total aggregate liability of EBH to all those named shall not exceed \$50,000 or EBH's total fee for services rendered on the project, whichever is greater. Such causes include, but are not limited to EBH's professional negligence, acts, errors, omissions, strict liability, breach of contract or warranty.

City of Goodland Home Rehabilitation Program Proposal

Purpose:

The purpose of this program is to assist eligible homeowners of Goodland with rehabilitation of their owner-occupied homes. The program will bring a home into compliance with housing codes and address health and safety issues.

Program Guidelines:

- The City will fund up to \$10,000 in grants for home improvements/repairs
- The repairs must cost a minimum of \$1,000 to correct
- The applicant is required to match at least 50% of project cost
- The City will match 50% of project cost up to \$3,000
- Grant recipients are required to live in their home for a period of _____ years after completion of the project or pay back awarded funds

Eligibility Requirements:

- The home must be located within the City boundaries of Goodland, Kansas
- The applicant must own and occupy his/her home as their primary residence
- All property taxes on the property must be current
- The applicant must be willing to verify low income status upon request
- Eligible projects are defined as:
 - Addressing accessibility needs
 - o Brick or masonry repair
 - Door and window repair/replacement
 - Driveway or walkway repair/ new paving
 - Electrical repairs
 - Exterior painting
 - → Fence repair/new fencing

- o Foundation repair/replacement
- Gutter repair/replacement
- o Hazardous materials abatement
- Retaining wall repair (if hazardous)
- o Roof repair or replacement
- Siding (if in poor condition)
- Structural repair
- Water/sewer line repair/replacement

Process:

- The City will develop an application form for interested individuals to submit
- Initial application period will be 45 days
- Applications reviewed monthly after initial application period
- City staff will review all applications and make recommendations to the City Commission
- Homes submitted for grant funding will be subject to before/after building inspection
- City Commission will approve desired projects
- Low-income households will be given preference when multiple qualifying applications exist
- Approved applicants will be required to sign a grant agreement with the City

- For projects using a contractor, City funds will be paid directly to contractor
- For projects being completed by applicant, funds will be paid as a reimbursement upon completion of the project and successful building inspection
