

In 2017, the City undertook a \$2.3 million Water Line Project to repair old and damaged water lines. Here are the recent calculations showing the benefit of pursuing this project:

## Water Loss

2016 - 16%

2017 - 15.3% = 50, 885, 050 gallons of water

2018 - 7.73% = 26, 744,000 gallons of water

\*The difference saved in a year is enough to supply the City with a whole month of water!

The 2018 water loss calculation is now well below the State's requirement. Newly installed water meters are also calculating more accurate water usage. We appreciate the hard work and diligence of our Public Works Department in completing this project.

## City Bidding Procedures & How The Process Works:

The City of Goodland regularly accepts "sealed bids" for projects, equipment and contract services. This means the City sends out a request, and interested bidders submit their best price or qualifications in a sealed envelope. All bids received are opened at the same time at a scheduled "bid opening" which is open to the public. This allows all bidders the ability to submit their costs fairly without fear of being undercut by the competition and ensures the City (i.e. taxpayer) gets the best price on goods and services. Current open bid requests are as follows:

IFB 2019-02: City Hall Basement/Sherman County Dispatch Remodel

IFB 2019-03: Electric and Public Works Department pickup trucks

IFB 2019-04: Sale of Residential Lot IFB 2019-05: Pest Control Services

IFB 2019-06: Code Enforcement Mowing RFQ 2019-01: Airport Consultant Services
