WHEAREAS,	In 1872 J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a
	special day be set aside for the planting of trees, and;

- **WHEAREAS,** this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska, and Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world, and;
- WHEAREAS, trees reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen and provide habitat for wildlife, and;
- **WHEAREAS**, trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and countless other wood products, and;
- **WHEAREAS**, trees in our City increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, and;
- **WHEAREAS,** trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal, and;

# WHEAREAS,Goodland has been recognized as a Tree City USA by The National Arbor Day<br/>Foundation for forty-two years and desires to continue its tree planting practices.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, We, the City of Goodland, do hereby proclaim April 30th, 2021 as Arbor Day in the City of Goodland and encourage all citizens and businesses to join in the celebration thereof, and we urge all citizens to plant trees to promote the well-being of this and all future generations.

Mayor John Garcia called the meeting to order with Vice-Mayor Jay Dee Brumbaugh, Commissioner Aaron Thompson, Commissioner J. J. Howard and Commissioner Gary Farris responding to roll call.

Also present were Dustin Bedore – Director of Electric Utilities, Frank Hayes – Chief of Police, Joshua Jordan – IT Director, Kenton Keith – Director of Streets and Facilities, Neal Thornburg – Director of Water and Wastewater, Danny Krayca – Director of Parks and Mary Volk - City Clerk.

### Mayor Garcia led Pledge of Allegiance

MOTION to amend agenda carried on a VOTE of 5-0. ON A MOTION by Commissioner Howard to approve Agenda as amended seconded by Commissioner Thompson. MOTION carried to approve the agenda as amended on a VOTE of 5-0.

### PUBLIC COMMENT

A. Dale Schields: Strategic Doing – As a board member of the Sherman County Community Foundation, I invite the Commission to our first Strategic Doing meeting this year on April 7<sup>th</sup>. We have worked with the Dane Hansen Foundation in the past for City projects that have come out of previous Strategic Doing process. Dane Hansen Foundation has requested we get involved in the process. Through this process we are getting things done; it is not just a planning stage. I am inviting all the Commission or a delegate from the commission. We are working on projects based on community needs. Collaboration is more effective than cooperation when you work for a united goal. The meeting is April 7<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 p.m. at the Elks Lodge and I encourage participation to help with City needs. It helps when people see the City and County Commission participating. Mayor Garcia asked, how long are meetings? Dale stated, not long, about two hours, but we like them shorter. Mayor Garcia stated, thank you, we appreciate the presentation and agree it is an important process. The Foundation has brought a lot of projects in the City to fruition.

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### **ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS**

- A. Resolution 1571: Hazard Mitigation Plan Mary stated, the City adopted a resolution in 2016 to become a participating jurisdiction under the Sherman County mitigation plan. The City continues under the County plan with this resolution. Mayor Garcia asked, this qualifies the City for FEMA money? Mary stated, yes if the event arises. ON A MOTION by Commissioner Howard to approve Resolution 1571: Hazard Mitigation Plan seconded by Commissioner Farris. MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.
- B. Resolution 1572: 2021 GAAP Waiver Mayor Garcia stated, the City approves this resolution annually for financial purposes. ON A MOTION by Vice-Mayor Brumbaugh to approve Resolution 1572: 2021 GAAP Waiver seconded by Commissioner Howard. MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.
- C. Resolution 1573: 2021 Designating Depositories Mary stated, the State requires the City to designate depositories annually. ON A MOTION by Commissioner Farris to approve Resolution 1573: 2021 Designating Depositories seconded by Commissioner Thompson. MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.

### FORMAL ACTIONS

A. Renewal of Property, Casualty and Liability Insurance – Jacque Livengood, owner Eklund Insurance stated, nothing has changed with your policy. Jeanette Ruddell is the agent doing all the planning. We met with Alan Lanning in December who said he was not entertaining bids this year. Jeanette reached out to Saville, your broker a couple years ago. When we had driver issues the insurance was moved to Saville, then came back to EMC last year. Nothing really changed, she did increase some liability, renewed cyber liability option and we have to give the drivers to EMC annually to review. We were informed of the driver violation that occurred so we let EMC know and they asked for the driver to be put on non-driver position. That is different from three years ago when you had drivers with DUI's and EMC cancelled the City policy. I am not sure the Commission understands that EMC has a unique municipality program that provides dividends, risk management, attorney direct and many other services municipalities receive free. There are not a lot of companies in the country that will write insurance for municipalities. The biggest holdback for the City of Goodland is the power plant, no one wants to write a policy to insure the power plant, but EMC has and will continue to insure. The premium did not even increase 4%. Mayor Garcia stated, the amount of the insurance is \$275,967. Jacque stated, we have been asked the last three years to bid the insurance, which we are happy to do for the City. However, a bidding process is a big undertaking and every time you request insurance be bid, there is a chance you lose a coverage. You can never bid apples to apples because every company has something different to offer. When we were to meet with Alan and Mary over the renewal, we met with Mary. We stated that we would really like to have an agreement with a three year commitment from the City, similar to what you do with your health insurance. During the term of the agreement, if your premium increased a lot we know we are going to look for a new market. Will we get one, we do not know but we would do our best. There are things we can do with EMC to cut the cost for the City. We would do what is best for the City; we have even previously given up commission. We would like to ask the Commission for a three year commitment so we know every year we are not bidding this out trying to find a new market. Bidding it out is very time consuming and you run the risk of losing something, even coverage when changing companies. Mayor Garcia stated, in previous discussions by the Commission, I feel that is a good idea but I would ask if you would bring a formal contract for the Commission to review and vote on at a different time. Mary stated, this request is in the communication form for the Commission. I

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> agree with the three year agreement to avoid risk of losing coverage, properties or vehicles not transferring to new policy. ON A MOTION by Commissioner Farris to approve renewal of EMC property, casualty and liability insurance from Eklund Insurance in the amount of \$275,967 seconded by Commissioner Howard. Commissioner Thompson asked, when did we receive information as to what the renewal was going to be? Jacque stated, because we were not in a bidding year we did not ask for a bid so Jeanette received it the end of March. She goes through every line and coverage in policy to make sure EMC did not change anything. This is normal and we usually meet with Mary and the City Manager the middle of March, have ever since 2018. If it is a bid process we have to ask for information from the company by a specific date. Timing for Commissioner Thompson stated, I was curious because this renewal is same as in past. information shows renewal was effective April 1 and we paid first premium tonight but we are approving the policy tonight. Jacque stated, we are happy to come to the meeting, but we usually do not come to the City meeting unless it is a bidding year. Commissioner Thompson stated, I am not sure we have to bid on renewal if it falls within the budget line item approved during budget process. Mayor Garcia stated, I understand what you are saying but it is a formality for the Commissioners. MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.

### REPORTS

A. City Manager - 1. Mary stated, in Alan's report, he needs to inform Commission the City received the Van Transportation Grant. We will continue operating on COVID funds until expired, then operate on 80/20 share. 2. Alan is also working on renewal of hangar lease with Eagle Med. Renewal language is same for another five years. It will come before Commission once Eagle Med approves lease.

### **B.** City Commissioners

Commissioner Thompson – 1. Appreciate Eklund's providing digital copies of insurance renewal and Mary for following through with my request so Commission can access information.
2. Next meeting we need to discuss City wide clean up and whether we are doing it this year.

**Vice-Mayor Brumbaugh** – 1. Poly Patch is working well on streets. What is cost of machine; is it worth looking into purchasing a machine? Kenton stated, a machine is about \$80,000, we only use it couple weeks a year, this year was a little more. The bill for this rental and ten pallets is about \$13,000.

**Commissioner Howard - 1.** I see Frisbee golf is in over by the pool. Dan stated, the City put in four baskets and the College will put in five. **2.** I noticed pictures of sewer project with our lines. Who all sees the pictures? Neal stated, we cameraed almost 16,000 feet of lines and found where we need to fix issues and where there are personal lines with issues. This is a process we do every year and they started digitizing the information to help us know the condition of our lines. It has saved us money on sewer rodding. Commissioner Howard stated, it looks like a beneficial project that we need to keep funding. **3.** Thanks to Eklund's on working on renewal of insurance. **4.** Thanks to the employees and all you do.

Commissioner Farris – 1. Kansas Street looks good with patching.

C. Mayor – 1. Department head reports are in your packets. I have read through the reports, they have been busy. I extend appreciation to our employees for the work they do. 2. Congratulations to Officer Feasel and Officer Luther on graduation from the Academy. Also good work on drug issue recently.

### I. <u>REQUEST OR ISSUE:</u>

The attached lease renewal is for Dave Faust, Inc., (DBA) Hawkeye Spraying. Hawkeye Spraying is exercising the option contained in the original lease for a 5-year extension, expiring in 2026.

### II. <u>RECOMMENDED ACTION / NEXT STEP:</u>

Motion to approve the lease extension under the terms of the original lease.

### III. FISCAL IMPACTS:

\$100 per year. \$500 for the term of the lease.

### IV. BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The previous lease had a 30 day notice auto renewal clause which is being exercised and is included for your review.

### AIRPORT LEASE

This lease, made and entered into this  $2^{12}$  day of <u>May</u>, 2016, between the City of Goodland, Kansas, a Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as LESSOR, and Dave Faust Inc., for (DBA) Hawkeye Spraying, hereinafter referred to as LESSEE shall herein upon giving LESSOR 30 days notice, have the right to four, five year renewal options. The first option being exercisable, on the  $2^{10}$  day of <u>May</u>, 2021.

WHEREAS, the LESSOR now owns the Goodland Municipal Airport; and,

WHEREAS, the LESSEE has requested that the LESSOR lease to it a certain tract of land at said airport for the purpose of maintaining and operating an aircraft hanger; and

WHEREAS, the LESSOR finds that it would be to the best interest of the community to lease said tract of land to LESSEE for the purpose above stated.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants hereinafter set out the parties agree as follows:

The LESSOR hereby leases the above named LESSEE the following described tract of land at the Goodland Municipal Airport, to-wit:

A tract of land in the Southwest Quarter (SW1/4) of Section Eight (8), Township Eight (8) South, Range Thirty-nine (39) West, of the 6<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian, in Renner Field-Goodland Municipal Airport, Goodland Kansas more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at the Southwest Corner of Section 8, Township 8 South, Range 39 West; thence, N2°23'38.08"E1212.28' along West line of said section; thence N65°24'8.35"E415.87' parallel to Runway 5/23 to Reference Point A.

Lot 5: From said Reference Point A, thence N65°24'8.35"E356.6' to the Point of Beginning thence, N65°24'8.35"E80'; thence N24°35'51.65"W150'; thence, S65°24'8.35"W80'; thence, S24°35'51.65"E150' to the Point of Beginning.

Lot 6: From said Reference Point A, thence N65°24'8.35"E436.6' to the Point of Beginning thence, N65°24'8.35"E80'; thence N24°35'51.65"W150'; thence, S65°24'8.35W80'; thence, S24°35'51.65"E150' to the Point of Beginning.

Lot 7: From said Reference Point A, thence N65°24'8.35"E516.6' to the Point of Beginning thence, N65°24'8.35"E80; thence N24°35'51.65"W150'; thence, S65°24'8.35W80'; thence, S24°35'51.65"E150' to the Point of Beginning.

This lease is subject to all existing easements. LESSOR shall have the right to future easements, but if said easements shall interfere with the LESSEES ability to use this lease for its intended purpose, then LESSOR shall compensate at a fair rate for said interference.

The LESSEE shall pay to the LESSOR a yearly rental fee of \$100/year. The LESSEE is also subject to an annual fee of one (1) cent per square foot/year based on the actual acreage leased by LESSEE. The yearly rental shall begin on the first day of this Lease and be due, in advance, on the same day of each year.

At the end of the Lease period, as hereinbefore set out, the said LESSEE shall have the right to remove all improvements placed upon the premises, and in the event of such removal, LESSEE agrees and covenants that it will replace the airport premises in a like condition as when the premises were taken.

The LESSOR reserves the right to further develop or improve the landing area on all publicly owned inter-navigation facilities of the airport as it sees fit regardless of the desires or views of the LESSEE and may prevent LESSEE from erecting or permitting to be erected any building or other structures, which in the opinion of LESSOR would limit the usefulness of the airport or constitute a hazard to aircraft. LESSEE shall maintain property to satisfaction of LESSOR and any buildings or other structures built or placed on the leased property, must be of a style and color approved by the LESSOR. LESSEE shall not make any material or substantial alterations or additions to the leased property without the prior written consent of LESSOR.

### ASSIGNMENT OR SUBLEASE

LESSEE shall not have the right to assign, sublease or transfer this lease agreement or any rights granted to LESSEE herein, nor shall LESSEE sell or convey this lease agreement or any right herein without the prior written approval of LESSOR.

#### NONEXCLUSIVE RIGHT

It is further understood and agreed that nothing herein shall be construed to grant or authorize the granting of an exclusive right with in the meaning of Section 308 of the Federal Aviation Act of 1958, as amended.

The LESSEE assures that it will undertake an affirmative action program as required by 14 CFR Part 152, Subpart E, to insure that no person shall, on the grounds of race, creed, color, national origin, or sex, be excluded from participating in any employment activities covered in 14 CFR Part 152, Subpart E. The LESSEE assures that no person shall be excluded on these grounds from participating in, or receiving the services or benefits of any program or activity covered by this subpart. The LESSEE assures that it will require that is covered sub-organizations provide assurances to the LESSOR that they similarly will undertake affirmative action programs and that they will require assurances from their sub-organization, as required by 14 CFR Part 152, Subpart E, to the same effect.

### SETBACK AND SIGHT COVERAGE

Unless otherwise reviewed by the Airport Board and approved by the Governing Body of the City of Goodland, Kansas, the following building setbacks from their property lines as above set out shall be observed.

- A. Side yard setbacks from the property lines shall be five (5) feet.
- B. Front yard setbacks shall be in line with the established building restriction line as approved by the Airport Board and the Governing Body.
- C. Rear yard setbacks shall be ten (10) feet.
- D. Maximum site coverage shall be sixty percent (60%).

#### UTILITIES

- A. Tie into city provided water and sewer systems when so provided by said City and when so requested in writing to do so by the LESSOR. Nothing herein shall be construed to require the LESSOR to provide water and sewer systems to LESSEE.
- B. To discontinue use of any water or sanitary facilities which are causing health or sanitary nuisances either to themselves or others when so requested to do so by the LESSOR. The LESSOR shall have exclusive jurisdiction and shall be the exclusive judge as to whether a health or sanitary nuisance exists.
- C. To provide such utility easements as are requested by the LESSOR outside of an area within twenty (20) feet of LESSEE'S main building.
- D. The LESSOR agrees to reimburse the LESSEE for damage done to facilities of the LESSEE or to restore same to a satisfactory condition as a result of any city utility work. This shall apply only if the LESSEE is operating said facilities in accordance with airport standards as herein set out, or written approved variations there from.

### **TAXES**

LESSEE shall be responsible for payment of all taxes and assessments levied against personal property owned by LESSEE and located on the leased property.

#### DANGEROUS SIGNS

No sign, light or device shall be permitted which, through illumination at night or glare during the day, could create hazard to aircraft. No sign over 200 square feet shall be constructed. No sign shall project over 25 feet above ground level. Signs are to be restricted to those identifying the name, business and products of the person or firm occupying the premises. Signs shall be located on the building except for small signs not to exceed 20 square feet which may be located off the building.

### HAZARDOUS AND NOXIOUS USES

- A. All volatile fluids and gases shall be stored in approved containers and same shall be less than five (5) gallons capacity and the aggregate of such material stored on the premises shall not exceed twenty-five (25) gallons.
- B. Dangerous poisons shall be kept indoors in a closed area and shall not be exposed so as to be a hazard to others.
- C. No business shall be conducted which will produce hazardous or excessive use, noise, odor, smoke, particulate matter, refuse, or toxic substances.
- D. LESSEE further agrees to admit the City Building Inspector and/or Fire Chief during reasonable hours of operation and to comply with City fire regulations and other reasonable safety regulations.
- E. LESSEE shall strictly follow any and all federal and state laws, statures, rules and regulations pertaining to environmental issues. LESSEE shall keep, protect, and save harmless LESSOR from any loss, cost, claim, or judgment of any sort or nature arising out of any event or occurrence resulting in an environmental hazard, which might cause liability to accrue to LESSOR.

### NATIONAL EMERGENCY

During the time of war or national emergency, the LESSOR shall have the right to enter into agreement with the United States Government for military or naval use or part or all of the landing area, the publicly owned air navigation facilities and other areas or facilities of the airport. If any such agreement is executed with the United States Government, provisions of this instrument insofar as they are inconsistent with the provisions of said agreement with the government, shall be superseded.

This agreement shall be subordinate to the provisions of any existing or future agreement between the LESSOR and the United States relative to the operation and maintenance of the airport, the execution, which has been made or may be required as a condition precedent to the expenditure of federal funds for the development of the airport.

LESSEE agrees to furnish service on fair, equal and not unjustly discriminatory basis to all users thereof, and to charge fair, reasonable and not unjustly discriminatory prices for each unit or service; PROVIDED that LESSEE may make reasonable and nondiscriminatory discounts, rebates, or other similar types of price reductions to volume purchasers.

### CERTIFICATE OF INSURANCE

LESSEE shall purchase at its own and sole expense and maintain in full force and effect during the term of this agreement and at all times that it is in possession of or has control over any part of LESSOR'S premises, airport liability insurance policy covering LESSOR in an amount of not less than \$500,000. LESSEE shall further insure that the LESSOR is added to the above described policy of insurance as a named insured and shall provide the LESSOR with current certificate of insurance during the term of this agreement as proof that said insurance has been purchased and is in effect.

### **INDEMNIFICATION**

LESSEE shall keep, protect, and save harmless LESSOR from any loss, cost, claim, judgment or experience of any sort or nature, and from any liability to any person, on account of any injury, damage or death to any person or property arising out of any use of the leased property by LESSEE, its agents or its employees. LESSEE further agrees to hold LESSOR harmless from any monetary fine or assessment placed upon LESSEE by the FAA or any other governmental agency having jurisdiction over LESSEE or Goodland Municipal Airport, if it is determined that the fine or assessment is a direct result of an act or omission of LESSEE.

#### MISCELLANEOUS

LESSEE further agrees to the following covenants:

Aircraft or private vehicles shall not be parked in any taxiway, right-of-way, or street so as to unreasonably impede traffic.

No personal property shall be stored outside the building located on the real property, which is the subject matter of this lease.

The Governing Body for the LESSOR shall approve any landscaping proposed by LESSEE.
