#### GOODLAND CITY COMMISSION Regular Meeting

#### May 3, 2021

#### 5:00 P.M.

Mayor John Garcia called the meeting to order with Vice-Mayor Jay Dee Brumbaugh, Commissioner Aaron Thompson, Commissioner J. J. Howard and Commissioner Gary Farris responding to roll call.

Also present were Dustin Bedore – Director of Electric Utilities, Frank Hayes – Chief of Police, Joshua Jordan – IT Director, Kenton Keith – Director of Streets and Facilities, Neal Thornburg – Director of Water and Wastewater, Danny Krayca – Director of Parks, Mary Volk - City Clerk and Alan Lanning - City Manager.

#### Mayor Garcia led Pledge of Allegiance

**Approval of Agenda** – **ON A MOTION by** Commissioner Farris to approve Agenda as presented seconded by Vice-Mayor Brumbaugh. **MOTION carried to approve agenda as presented on a VOTE of 5-0.** 

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

#### **PRESENTATIONS & PROCLAMATIONS**

- A. Child Advocacy Center Tony Bernett with Western Kansas Child Advocacy Center stated, our center started in Scott City and now covers thirty four counties for child abuse. Most cases are child sexual abuse. We are asking for a small budget request in 2022 from the City, up to \$5,000. We currently work in Sherman County, asking law enforcement to be involved because many cases end up in the courts. Sherman County and other neighboring governmental agencies support the Center. Mayor Garcia stated, we are starting budget discussions in near future so will consider your request.
- B. Airport Board Dustin Stephenson, President and Jon Yost, Vice President of Airport Board are present to update Commission on the airport. Dustin stated, we have received some grants for projects at the airport. Construction on the taxiway is estimated to begin May 17<sup>th</sup>. The project is planned in two phases so we do not interrupt the Ag sprayers. Our next project is to extend crosswind runway 5/23. Bids will be opened May 13<sup>th</sup>. Mayor Garcia asked, is the extension 400 instead of 500 feet? Dustin stated, the increase is 200 feet, from 3,800 to 4,000 feet. Alan stated, in previous meetings the Commission discussed leases and the approach taken for the cost of leases. The Commission feels the cost is fairly inexpensive. Dustin stated, airport leases are a hot topic. In Goodland, we encourage growth and to build our airport. A new business at the airport will bring people to the community or provide opportunities for the community. If the leases are too expensive and short term, they are not attractive. For specific lease terms, the longer the better to promote growth. From a cost standpoint the board feels the costs are where they should be. The City receives the benefit of property taxes. The businesses benefit the community financially long term. Jon stated, I agree with Dustin. If an individual has a big project with short term lease, they are sticking their neck out. Dustin stated, most business owners in town own the land where their building sits but at the airport the City owns the land where the hanger sits. There is no disadvantage to a long term lease because if it does not work out, they sell the building and a business continues. Mayor Garcia stated, I agree with Jon and Dustin.

  - **ON A MOTION by** Vice-Mayor Brumbaugh to approve Consent Agenda seconded by Commissioner Farris. **MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.**

#### FORMAL ACTIONS

- A. Topside Manor Building Permit Kevin Rasure President of Public Building Commission and Topside Manor Board stated, we appreciate the City's attendance at our ground breaking. Our project foreman appreciates your staff and the good job they do. We previously discussed building permit fees but no formal action was taken. Mayor Garcia stated, we have waived fees for other businesses. I am in favor of waiving the \$3,051 fee with the dollars being spent and the economic impact on the community. ON A MOTION by Commissioner Thompson to approve waiving the building permit fee for Topside Manor in the amount of \$3,051 seconded by Commissioner Howard. MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.
- **B. Barker Airport Lease** Alan stated, Danny Barker came in recently to request space to build a hangar. We determined lots one and two would fit his needs. **ON A MOTION by** Commissioner Farris to approve the Airport Lease with Barker Farm Services **seconded by** Vice-Mayor Brumbaugh. **MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.**
- C. Global Medical Response (EagleMed) Airport Lease Alan stated, we did not receive the signed lease back so we will address item next meeting.
- D. Housing Rehabilitation Applications Alan stated, we received two applications which both meet requirements of the program in the amount of \$6,000. There are \$10,000 in funding available for program. I recommend approval of these two applications. Commissioner Thompson stated, I am glad to see people use program. ON A MOTION by Commissioner Howard to proceed with the two rehabilitation applications seconded by Commissioner Farris. MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.
- **E. IFB 2021-03 Pest Control Bids** Alan stated, we received two bids for services. Pest Away was low bid at an annual cost of \$5,519.40. **ON A MOTION by** Commissioner Farris to approve the low bid from Pest Away in the amount of \$5,519.40 annually, for two years **seconded by** Commissioner Howard. **MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.**
- F. IFB 2021-04 Code Enforcement Mowing Bid Award Alan stated, we received two bids for nuisance mowing and recommend low bid from Nancy Gilmer in the amount of \$30 per hour. ON A MOTION by Commissioner Farris to approve the low bid from Nancy Gilmer in the amount of \$30 per hour seconded by Commissioner Thompson. MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.
- **G.** Street Improvements Bid Award John stated, I was contacted by Matt Miller of Miller Construction Services with regards to project bids. We have a policy if local bid is within 10%, we accept local bid. Miller Construction Services bid is within 10%. Alan stated, we were of same decision; however, the KDOT contract states we have to approve low bid. If it is part of a bid process, local preference must be specified up front and it was not in this bidding. Andrew stated, we typically agree with local preference. We do not include in the bid process when it is a cost share agreement. Commissioner Thompson stated, in the Cost Share Agreement with KDOT it states, we "shall award the contract to the lowest Responsible Bidder upon concurrence in the award by the Secretary." Andrew stated, yes that is in cost share agreement between the City and State. Mayor Garcia stated, in future bids staff needs to make sure 10% local bidding preference is noted in bid documents. Alan stated, with a State Cost Share Agreement I do not believe that

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will matter. It will work on local bidding but not State projects. Commissioner Thompson stated, the contract with the State is 85/15 cost share on construction. Andrew stated, the bids are broken out by street project because of the project timeline for each street and harvest interference for 17<sup>th</sup> Street. I have kept Sherman County Commissioner Blake informed on the process because of the County's cost share on 2<sup>nd</sup> street. **ON A MOTION by** Commissioner Farris to approve the low bid from Sporer Land Development in the amount of \$814,946, contingent upon the approval from the Secretary of Transportation seconded by Commissioner Thompson. **MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0**.

H. .gov Domain Registration – Joshua stated, this is request to register domain for email. .gov is a more trusted site that started waiving fees for registration. They require the governing body signature for approval. Mayor Garcia asked, do you anticipate fees in the future? Joshua stated, I do not know, they may change fee structure in the future. Only way can get this is through the government. Mayor Garcia asked, will we be keeping City of Goodland domain for a while? Joshua stated, yes until I get everything transferred over. ON A MOTION by Vice-Mayor Brumbaugh to approve the .gov request seconded by Commissioner Thompson. MOTION carried on a VOTE of 5-0.

#### **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

- A. Prohibited Dog Breeds Alan stated, the Commission asked us to return with a recommendation. Animals are covered in a number of places in the code. Section 2-219 covers vicious animals which is where we feel animals should be regulated. I feel Commission should repeal Division 2
   Breed Specific Regulations and regulate under Vicious Animal section of code. Many Cities have also repealed breed specific ordinances. Consensus of Commission is to proceed to repeal Division 2.
- B. Tower Point Alan stated, the City was approached by a company that leases cell phone towers. We have one on our tower along with our local communications which will remain. The proposal is to lease the ground the tower is on \$50,000. They make their money by adding additional providers to tower. We would get 50% of their annual revenue from other providers. The risk is no additional providers are added to the tower. I do not feel they would make proposal unless they felt it would benefit them. At this price the tower will be covered for 8.3 years, but the way technology changes we may not need tower in the future. Mayor Garcia stated, I would like to see numbers. Alan stated, those are definite numbers. City gets 50% of additional income. They lease tower, we get ground lease money and a share of the tower spots they lease. Consensus of Commission is to proceed with lease.

#### REPORTS

A. City Manager - 1. We received the first draft of the Inter-local Fire Agreement. We have a few things we are interested in changing then we will bring back for Commission review. Mayor Garcia stated, I asked Alan to get the agreement to the Commission as soon as available. 2. City wide cleanup is Thursday and Friday. 3. We are meeting with KMEA on Monday to discuss power contract options.

 2. On the water towers, looks like there are some issues? Neal stated, I am concerned why some issues have not been addressed. There are some major issues with the towers and we are under contract with the company so unsure why they have not been addressed.

#### AGREEMENT FOR ADMINISTRATIVE CONSULTING SERVICES OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT FUNDS

THIS AGREEMENT made this **17th day of May**, **2021** by and between THE NORTHWEST KANSAS PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION (NWKP&DC), hereinafter referred to as "ADMINISTRATIVE CONSULTANT", and **the City of Goodland** of the State of Kansas, hereinafter referred to as "City".

Whereas, City is submitting a Small Cities Community Development Block Grant Application for the purpose of **CDBG-CV**.

Whereas, if funded, the project requires Community Development Block Grant Funds for completion;

Now, therefore, City engages the services of an Administrative Consultant upon the following terms and conditions:

#### 1. <u>TERMINATION OF CONTRACT FOR CAUSE</u>

If, through any cause, either party shall fail to fulfill in timely and proper manner their obligations under this Contract, or if either party shall violate any of the covenants, agreements, or stipulations of this Contract, the Parties shall thereupon have the right to terminate this Contract by giving written notice to the other of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof. This notice shall not be less than thirty days prior to the effective date. In such event, all finished or unfinished documents, studies and reports prepared by the Administrative Consultant under this Contract shall become the property of the Administrative Consultant, who shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any work satisfactorily completed hereunder, in accordance with this Contract.

#### 2. <u>CHANGES</u>

The City may, from time to time, request changes in the scope of the services of the Administrative Consultant to be performed hereunder. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of the Administrative Consultant's compensation, which are mutually agreed upon by and between the City and the Administrative Consultant, shall be incorporated in written amendments to this Contract.

#### 3. <u>PERSONNEL</u>

- A. The Administrative Consultant represents that he has, or will secure at his own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this Contract. Such personnel shall not be employees of or have any contractual relationship with the City.
- B. All of the services required hereunder will be performed by the Administrative Consultant or under his/her supervision and all personnel shall be fully qualified to perform such services.
- C. None of the work or services covered by this Contract shall be subcontracted without the prior written approval of the City. Any work or services

subcontracted hereunder shall be specified by written contract or agreement and shall be subject to each provision of this Contract.

#### 4. <u>SERVICES OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE CONSULTANT</u>

Services outlined in this proposal are those necessary to effectively administer a CDBG Grant for Community Improvement. The following summary of services is not intended to limit the scope of service but is intended to illustrate the work and services to be provided by the NWKP&DC. The service is divided into phases which are Grant Award, Procurement of Professional Services, Civil Rights/Procurement Policy, Financial Management, Bidding, Construction, and Close-Out.

#### Grant Award

- 1. Handles and furnishes any details that the Kansas Department of Commerce (KDOC) may require.
- 2. Provides file labels for grantees files.

#### Environmental Procedures

- 1. Determine and discuss with KDOC the environmental category that applies to the project.
- 2. Prepares the required Environmental Review for the project.
- 3. If an Environmental Impact Statement is required, assist the City in the securing of professional services for the report.
- 4. Send all required agencies the environmental information so that the environmental review can be cleared. Refers all questioned responses to the proper party.
- 5. Drafts and furnishes the City all legal notices required to meet KDOC's environmental publication requirements.
- 6. Instructs the City staff throughout the environmental review process.
- 7. Conducts with the City any public hearings that may be necessary.
- 8. Prepares for the City the Request for Release of Funds Notice.
- 9. Prepares for the City the Finding of No Significant Impact Notice.
- 10. Prepares for the City the Environmental Certification Form.
- 11. Processes all forms and mails to KDOC field representative.

#### Procurement of Professional Services

- 1. Assist the City in the procurement of architectural or engineering services if necessary.
- 2. Send Requests for Qualifications to Engineers or Architects, including minority bidders.
- 3. Answer project questions raised by professionals.
- 4. Attend opening and award of professional services by the City.
- 5. Educate local officials about the rating system and provide rating form.
- 6. Notify all firms of the outcome.
- 7. No member of the NWKP&DC staff will participate in the selection of the professional.

#### Civil Rights/Procurement Policy

- 1. Complete Civil Rights Demographics Form prior to the first Quarterly Report.
- 2. Prepare Notice of Fair Housing/Civil Rights Contact Person Form prior to the first Quarterly Report.
- 3. Assist the City in identifying the proper Civil Rights Activity to be performed by the City. NWKP&DC will not conduct this Civil Rights Activity; it is the responsibility of the City.
- 4. Assists the City in the development and adoption of the required local Procurement Policy, if necessary.
- 5. Assist the City in adopting a procedure in handling Fair Housing complaints.

#### Financial Management

- 1. Assists City in the establishment of a Financial Management System (Grant Accounting System).
- 2. Prepares all Requests for Funds (Drawdowns) for City action. Presents drawdowns to the City on an as-needed basis. If not presented, drawdowns will be mailed or faxed to the City for approval and signatures.
- 3. Prepares the Actual Cash Disbursements Reports along with Drawdown requests.
- 4. Prepares Quarterly Reports.
- 5. Reviews all payment requests including back-up invoices to assure compliance with the grant.
- 6. Delivers or mails all back-up invoices to the City for record retention.
- 7. Prepares for the City a disbursement sheet for each pay request to assist in bill payment.

#### **Bidding**

- 1. Will apply for and furnish Davis-Bacon wage rates for all required contracts.
- 2. Assists in the preparation of bid documents. Furnishes required Labor, Civil Rights, and other federal standards.
- 3. Reviews bid documents for federal compliance.
- 4. Review legal notices and monitors to assure bid procedure compliance.
- 5. Attends bid opening when possible to review and confirm General Contractor eligibility.
- 6. Reviews all contracts for compliance with CDBG standards.

#### **Construction**

- 1. Attends pre-construction conference and reviews Labor Standard Requirements. Prepare minutes of this conference for City's file.
- 2. Prepares and forwards all notices and forms to KDOC covering bids, preconstruction conference, awards, start dates, and contracts.
- 3. Trains and assists the appointed Labor Standards Officer. Assists officer in the maintenance of records and files.
- 4. Receive and review employee payroll and interview sheets. Review for Labor Standards Compliance and deliver to the City for the pertinent file.
- 5. Maintains constant contact with KDOC. Attends all KDOC monitoring visits and assists City with KDOC compliance letters.

- 6. Reports any major changes in schedule to the City.
- 7. Coordinates payments and schedules with engineer/architect.

#### Close-Out

- 1. Upon completion of the project, the Administrative Consultant shall complete the KDOC close-out packet.
- 2. Assure that a final inspection is made.
- 3. Assist the City in the procurement of a qualified auditing firm if necessary.
- 4. Prepare the Legal Notice for the Performance Public Hearing and attends the hearing.

#### 5. <u>RECORDS AND AUDITS</u>

The Administrative Consultant and the City shall maintain accounts and records, including personnel, property and financial records, adequate to identify and account for all costs pertaining to the Contract and such records as may be deemed necessary by the City to assure proper accounting for all project funds, both Federal and non-Federal shares. These records will be made available for audit purposes to the City or any authorized representative. Following completion of the audit and the closing of the grant, the records will be returned to the City Clerk for the City's retention.

The Administrative Consultant shall assist the City in developing a Financial Management System which will meet the KDOC standards and in particular those which will comply with Common Rule. This will include the designation of a local depository for grant funds and the establishment of the letter-of-credit fund drawdown system.

The City will be responsible for having the records audited by a Certified Public Accountant at the completion of the construction project, if required. The expense for this audit will be a responsibility of the City.

#### 6. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH LOCAL LAWS</u>

The Administrative Consultant shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and codes of the State and local governments.

#### 7. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

During the performance of this contract, the Administrative Consultant agrees as follows:

A. The Administrative Consultant will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, sex, color, religion, age, national origin, or family status. The Administrative Consultant will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, creed, sex, color, religion, age, national origin, or family status. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. 8. 14. The Administrative Consultant will comply with <u>Executive Order 11063</u> as amended by Executive Order 12259 and implementing regulations as 24 CFR Part 107.

15. The Administrative Consultant will comply with the provisions of the <u>Kansas Act</u> <u>Against Discrimination</u>, and shall not discriminate against any persons in the performance of work done under this contract or not provide full and equal housing because of race, religion, color, sex, physical handicapped, national origin, ancestry, or family status. In all solicitations or advertisement to employees, the Debtor shall include the phrase, "Equal Opportunity Employer", or a similar phrase to be approved by the State Civil Rights Commission.

16. The Administrative Consultant will comply with <u>Section 3</u> of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended 12 U.S.C. 1701u.

17. The Administrative Consultant will comply with <u>Executive Order 11246</u>, as amended by Executive Orders 11375 and 12086 and implementing regulations issued at 41 CFR Chapter 60.

18. <u>Section 912 of the Cranston-Gonzales National Affordable Housing Act of 1990</u>, amended Section 109 (a) of the HCD Act to prohibit discrimination on the basis of religion.

19. <u>Section 503 of Rehabilitation Act of 1973</u>, as amended, provides for the nondiscrimination in contractor employment.

20. The Administrative Consultant will comply with <u>Title I of the Housing and Community</u> <u>Development Act of 1974</u>, as amended.

21. The Administrative Consultant will comply with <u>Section 519</u>, <u>Public Law 101-144</u> (the 1990 HUD Appropriation Act).

22. <u>Restriction on Lobbying Contracts over \$100,000</u>, NWKP&DC has not paid, or agreed to pay, to any firm, organization of persons (other than a bonafide employee working solely for the NWKP&DC any fee, contribution, donation, or consideration of any kind for, or in consideration with, procuring or carrying out this agreement.

#### 23. INTEREST OF MEMBERS OF A CITY

No members of the governing body of the City and no other officer, employee, or agent of the City, who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the planning and carrying out of the program, shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect, in this Contract; and the Administrative Consultant shall take appropriate steps to ensure compliance.

#### 24. INTEREST OF AMINISTRATIVE CONSULTANT AND EMPLOYEES

The Administrative Consultant covenants that he presently has no interest and shall not acquire interest, direct or indirect, in the study area or any parcels therein or any other interest which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of his services hereunder. The Administrative Consultant further covenants that in the performance of this Contract, no person having any such interest shall be employed.

#### 25. <u>FEES</u>

The City agrees to pay the Administrative Consultant a fee for the services outlined on a per item basis. This contract does not include publication costs (city expense).

# I. <u>REQUEST OR ISSUE:</u>

The current lease for Med-Trans Corporation at Renner field expires on 5-15-2021. The attached lease is intended to renew the lease for another 5-year period. The rate (\$950.00/month) and other conditions of the lease remain the same.

The attached lease is for the 532 Renner Field hangar space. This is a renewal of the existing lease which expires 5-15-2021. All conditions of the lease are consistent with the previous lease term, 2016-2021.

### **LEASE AGREEMENT**

This lease agreement was entered into on \_\_\_\_ day of May, 2021 between the City of Goodland, Kansas, a Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as LESSOR, and Med-Trans Corporation hereinafter referred to as LESSEE,

#### RECITALS

The parties recite and declare:

- A. Lessor is the sole owner of an Airplane Hanger Facility described below, having space for lease in such premises.
- B. Lessee is in the business of providing air ambulance services and desires to lease space from Lessor.
- C. The parties desire to enter a lease agreement defining their respective rights, duties, and liabilities relating to the premises.

In consideration of the mutual covenants contained in this lease agreement, the parties agree as follows:

# Section One Description of Premises

A. Lessor leases to lessee premises located at 532 Renner Field Road, City of Goodland, County of Sherman, State of Kansas and legally described as follows:

A lot on the Goodland Municipal Airport in the Southwest Quarter (SW ¼) of Section Eight (8), Township Eight (8) South, Range Thirty-nine (39) West, of the 6<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian, City of Goodland, Sherman County, Kansas; described as follows:

Commencing at the Southwest Corner of said Section Eight (8); thence Northerly along the west line of said section 2107.81 feet; thence North 90° 0' East, 611.83 feet to the Point of Beginning; thence South 43° 17' 41" East, 93 feet; thence North 46° 42' 19" East; 185 feet; thence North 43° 17' 41" West, 93 Feet; thence South 46° 42' 19" West, 185 feet to the Point of Beginning. This lot contains 0.39 acres, more or less.

B. The demised premises shall be used for the purpose of an airplane hangar for the parking and storage of an airplane or airplanes, and for no other purpose. The demised premises are located on retail/commercial property presently zoned for the following purposes: retail/commercial. This includes the purpose for which Lessee desires the premises.

### Section Two Term of Lease

This lease agreement shall last for five years to commence on May \_\_\_\_\_, 2021 and terminate on May \_\_\_\_\_, 2026. Either party may terminate the lease by giving the other party 30 days written notice sent to the person identified later in this lease at the address specified.

Lessee shall surrender the premises to Lessor immediately on termination of the lease.

# Section Three Rental

Lessee shall pay \$950.00 per month for the term of this lease agreement. Payments shall be made to lessor at the address specified below and shall be made by the 5<sup>th</sup> day of the month. A payment shall be delinquent if not paid by the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month.

On Lessee's failure to pay the rental on a timely basis, Lessor shall have the right to terminate this lease agreement, and the lease agreement will thereupon be forfeited.

### Section Four Restrictions on Use

Lessee shall not use or permit the demised premises, or any part of the demised premises, to be used for any purpose other than those set forth in this lease agreement. Lessee shall neither permit on the demised premises any act, sale, or storage that may be prohibited under standard forms of fire insurance policies, nor use the premises for any such purpose. In addition, no use shall be made or permitted to be made that shall result in the (1) waste on the demised premises, (2) a public or private nuisance that may disturb the quiet enjoyment of other tenants in the building, (3) improper, unlawful, or objectionable use, including sale, storage or preparation, of food, alcoholic beverages, or materials generating an odor on the premises, or (4) noises or vibrations that may disturb

other tenants. Lessee shall comply with all governmental regulations and statutes affecting the demised premises either now or in the future.

# Section Five Abandoning Premises or Personal Property

Lessee shall not vacate or abandon the demised premises at any time during the term of this lease agreement. If Lessee does vacate or abandon the demised premises or is dispossessed by process of law, any personal property belonging to Lessee and left on the demised premises shall be deemed abandoned at the option of Lessor and shall become the property of Lessor.

# Section Six Taxes

Lessor shall pay all real property taxes on the property.

# Section Seven Utilities

Lessee shall pay for all utilities on the premises.

# Section Eight Alterations and Modification; Repairs

- A. Lessee has inspected the demised premises, and they are now in a tenantable and good condition.
- B. Lessee shall take good care of the demised premises and shall not alter, repair, or change the demised premises without the prior, express and written consent of Lessor.
- C. All altercations, improvements, and changes that Lessee may desire shall be done either by or under the direction of Lessor, but at the expense of Lessee and shall become the property of Lessor and remain on the demised premises, except that at the option of Lessor, Lessee shall, at its expense, remove from the demised premises all partitions, counters, railing, and similarly installed improvements when surrendering the demised premises.
- D. All damage or injury done to the demised premises by Lessee or any person who may be in or on the demised premises with the consent of Lessee shall be paid for by Lessee.

E. Lessee shall, at the termination of this lease agreement, surrender the demised premises to Lessor in as good condition and repair as reasonable and proper use of the premises will permit.

### Section Nine Destruction of Premises

- A. Any partial destruction of the demised premises shall neither annul nor void this lease agreement, except that Lessee shall be entitled to the proportionate reduction of rent while the repairs are being made, any proportionate reduction being based on the extent to which the making of repairs shall interfere with the business carried on by Lessee on the demised premises. If the repairs cannot be made in the specified time, Lessor may, at Lessor's option make repairs within a reasonable time, this lease agreement continuing in full force and effect and the rent to be proportionately rebated as previously set forth in this section. In the even that Lessor elects not to make repairs, or if repairs cannot be made under the laws and regulations of the applicable governmental authorities, this lease agreement may be terminated at the option of either party.
- B. A total destruction of the building in which the demised premises are situated shall terminate this lease agreement.

## Section Ten Condemnation

A condemnation of the entire building or a condemnation of the portion of the demised premises occupied by Lessee shall result in a termination of this lease agreement. Lessor shall receive the total of any consequential damages awarded as a result of condemnation proceedings. All future rent installments to be paid by Lessee under this lease shall be terminated.

# Section Eleven Assignment and Sublease

Lessee shall not assign any rights or duties under this lease agreement nor sublet the demised premises or any part of the demised premises, nor allow any other person to occupy or use the demised premises without the prior, express, and written consent of Lessor. A consent to one assignment, sublease, or occupation or use by any other person,

shall not be a consent to any subsequent assignment, sublease or occupation or use by another person. Any assignment or subletting without consent shall be void.

This lease agreement shall not be assignable, as to the interest of Lessee, by operation of law, without the written consent of Lessor.

# Section Twelve Breach or Default

Lessee shall have breached this lease agreement and shall be considered in default under this lease agreement if (1) Lessee fails to pay any rent when due and does not make the delinquent payment within 3 days after receipt of notice thereof from Lessor, or (2) Lessee fails to perform or comply with any of the covenants or conditions of this lease agreement and such failure continues for a period of three days after receipt of notice thereof from Lessor.

# Section Thirteen Effect of Breach

In the event of a breach of this lease agreement as set forth in Section Twelve, the rights of Lessor shall be as follows:

- A. Lessor shall have the right to cancel and terminate this lease agreement, as well as all of the right, title, and interest of Lessee under this lease agreement, by giving to Lessee not less than 10 days' notice of the cancellation and termination. On expiration of the time fixed in the notice, this lease agreement and the right, title, and interest of Lessee under the lease agreement shall terminate in the same manner and with the same force and effect, except as to Lessee's liability, as if the date fixed in the notice of cancellation and termination were the end of the lease term.
- B. Lessor may elect, but shall not be obligated, to make any payment required of Lessee in this lease agreement or comply with any agreement, term or condition required by this lease agreement or comply with any agreement, term, or condition required by this lease agreement to be performed by Lessee. Lessor shall have the right to enter the demised premises for the purpose of correcting or remedying any such default and to remain until the default has been corrected or remedied. However, any expenditure by Lessor incurred in any such correction of a default shall not be deemed to waive or release Lessee's default or Lessor's right to take any action as may be otherwise permissible under this lease agreement in the case of any default.

- C. Lessor may reenter the demised premises immediately and remove the property and personnel of Lessee, and store the property in a public warehouse or at a place selected by Lessor, at the expense of Lessee. After reentry Lessor may terminate this lease agreement on giving 10 days' written notice of termination to Lessee. Without the notice, reentry will not terminate this lease agreement. On termination, Lessor may recover from Lessee all damages proximately resulting from the breach, including the cost of recovering the demised premises and the worth of the balance of this lease agreement over the reasonable rental value of the demised premises for the remainder of the lease term, which sum shall be immediately due Lessor from Lessee.
- D. After reentry, Lessor may re-let the demised premises or any part of the demised premises for any term without terminating this lease agreement, at the rent and on the terms of Lessor may choose. Lessor may make alterations and repairs to the demised premises. In addition to Lessee's liability to Lessor for breach of the lease agreement, Lessee shall be liable for all expenses of the re-letting, for the alterations and repairs made and for the difference between the rent received by Lessor under the new lease agreement and the rent installments that are due for the same period under this lease agreement.

Lessor shall have the right to apply the rent received from re-letting the premises (a) to reduce Lessee's indebtedness to Lessor under this lease agreement, not including indebtedness for rent. (b) to expenses of the re-letting and alterations and repairs made, (c) to rent due under this lease agreement, or (d) to payment of future rent under this lease agreement as it becomes due.

If the new Lessee does not pay a rent installment promptly to Lessor, and the rent installment has been credited in advance of payment to the indebtedness of Lessee other than rent, or if rentals from the new Lessee have been otherwise applied by Lessor as provided for in this section, and during any rent installment period, are less than the rent payable for the corresponding installment period under this lease agreement, Lessee shall pay Lessor the deficiency, separately for each rent installment deficiency period and before the end of that period. Lessor may at any time after a re-letting terminate this lease agreement for the breach on which Lessor had based on the reentry and subsequently re-let the premises.

# Section Fourteen Unlawful Detainer and Attorney Fees

In case suit shall be brought for an unlawful detainer of the demised premises, for the recovery of any rent due under the provisions of this lease agreement, or for Lessee's

breach of any other condition contained in this lease agreement. Lessee shall pay to Lessor a reasonable attorney fee that shall be fixed by the court. Any such attorney feel shall be deemed to have accrued on the commencement of the action and shall be paid on the successful completion of the action by Lessor. Lessee shall be entitled to attorney fees in the same manner if judgment is rendered for Lessee.

# Section Fifteen Remedies of Lessor Cumulative

The remedies given to Lessor in this lease agreement shall be cumulative, and the exercise of any one remedy by Lessor shall not be to the exclusion of any other remedy.

# Section Sixteen Governing Law

It is agreed that this lease agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Kansas.

# Section Seventeen Waivers

Waiver by Lessor of any breach of any covenant or duty of Lessee under this lease is not a waiver of a breach of any other covenant or duty of Lessee, or of any subsequent breach of the same covenant or duty.

# Section Eighteen Entire Agreement

This lease agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties. Any prior understanding or representation of any kind preceding the execution of this lease agreement shall not be binding upon either party except to the extent incorporated in this lease agreement.

# Section Nineteen Modification of Agreement

Any modification of this lease agreement or additional obligation assumed by either party in connection with this agreement shall be binding only if evidenced in a writing signed by each party or an authorized representative of each party.

# Section Twenty Notices

All notices, demands, or other writings in this lease agreement provided to be given or made or sent, or which may be given or made or sent, by either party to the other, shall be deemed to have been fully given of made or sent when made in writing and deposited in the United States mail, registered and postage prepaid and addressed as follows:

Lessee: Med-Trans Corporation 209 State Hwy 121, Ste. 21 Lewisville, TX 75067

The address to which any notice, demand, or other writing may be given or made or sent to any party as above provided may be changed by written notice given by such party as above provided.

# Section Twenty-One Counterparts

This lease agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which together shall be constitute but one and the same instrument.

# Section Twenty-Two Paragraph Headings

The titles to the paragraphs of this lease agreement are solely for the convenience of the parties and shall not be used to explain modify, simplify or aid in the interpretation of the provisions of this lease agreement.
