City Crews will pick up any discarded items throughout this week, but only **one** pass through town will be made, so please place all items to the curb by Wednesday, May 3rd.

NO materials may be placed to the curb **BEFORE** Friday, April 28th.

The following items will **NOT** be permitted:

Tires, Grass, Garden Waste, Paint, Household Hazardous Waste

Trees limbs need to be cut to 4 foot length.

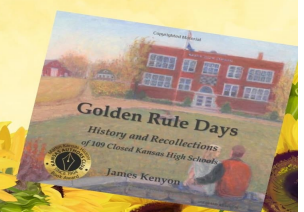

A \$25.00 permit is required.

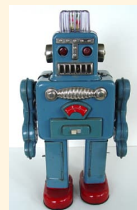

We throw away enough wood  
and paper to heat

### **PAY BILLS ONLINE**

If all households in the U.S. paid  
their bills online & received  
electronic statements, we'd save  
18.5 million trees every year, 2.2  
billion tons of carbon dioxide &  
other greenhouse gases, & 1.7  
billion pounds of solid waste.



### **RECYCLE GLASS**

Recycled glass reduces  
related air pollution by 20  
percent and related water  
pollution by 50 percent. If it  
isn't recycled it can take a  
million years to decompose.



### **CHANGE YOUR LIGHT**

If every household in the United  
State replaced one regular  
lightbulb with one of those new  
compact fluorescent bulbs, the  
pollution reduction would be
